RICE-SQUASH GRIDDLE CAKES WITH TOMATO SAUCE

Here is a new idea for griddle cakes and a good answer to the problem of creating a hearty, flavorful and economical vegetable supper dish for a main course. The tomato sauce is smoky-flavored with bacon and is perky tasting over the mild-rice, delicate squash-flavored griddle cakes. (Leave out the slice of diced bacon if an all-vegetable dish is required.) These cakes make quite a satisfying luncheon or supper served with tossed green salad, fruit gelatin and assorted cookies.

- 1 clove garlic, minced
2 cups coarsely grated yellow squash (3/4 pound)
2 cups cooked rice
Beat together eggs, flour, salt and pepper until smooth. Stir in remaining ingredients. Using about 1/3 cup batter for each pancake, fry on a hot, greased griddle until golden brown. Serve with tomato sauce. Yields 4 servings, 2 pancakes each.

TOMATO SAUCE

- 1 slice bacon, diced (optional)
1 cup (8 oz. can) tomato sauce
1/2 cup water
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1 clove garlic, minced
1 teaspoon onion juice
Fry bacon until crisp in small saucepan; drain off drippings. Add remaining ingredients and simmer about 15 minutes.

RICE-SQUASH GRIDDLE CAKES

- 2 eggs, slightly beaten
1/2 cup unsifted flour
1/2 cup water
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1/2 cup coarsely grated yellow squash
2 tablespoons minced onion
2 tablespoons minced parsley
